



REPORT ON PROGRESS OF RENOVATIONS TO THE HOLBEACH CERETERY CHAPEL

NOVEMBER 1960

Work was commenced on the renovations at the above on the 6th September and work has carried on continuously since that date both on site and in 's stonemasons yard.

The work to date has been regularly supervised by us and is progressing satisfactorily.

The state of the building was very much as anticipated, although the condition of some of the stone buttresses at roof level were a little worse than at first thought and work in this part was a little more extensive than we believe was first anticipated.

The renovation to the eastern side of the chapel is now practically completed, new stones have been put in the arch, buttresses, copings, drips and pinnacles etc. and the brickwork has been re-pointed as the work proceeded. The stonework to the head of the small window at high level has yet to be replaced, the stone however is now on site.

Work is now under way to the renovation of the stonework undermeath the tower and the ribs and springing stones to the vaulting have in part been replaced.

The stonework over the entrance door to the south chapel is very badly decayed and really requires replacing as it is unsightly. Its replacement is not vital from a weathering point of view, but really should be done from an appearance point of view and we shall be glad to receive specific an appearance point this at an early date. Work will continue with the instructions about this at an early date. Work will continue with the renovation of the west side of the chapel which is, if anything, in a poorer condition than the east side.

Instructions have also been given to to pay particular attention to the points where moisture have been getting into the building and causing to a large extent the decay in the stonework and to this end they are putting lead flashings over the projecting gable stones above the main arches to stop this water getting down behind.

When a detailed inspection was made of the crosses surmounting the gables just mentioned it was found that the iron dowels and stays which attach these heavy stone crosses to the building had badly rusted where exposed and in particular where they were inside the stonework. The process of rusting causes the iron to expand which has, in fact, split the stone and and made these heavy crosses dangerous. The cross on the south side was evidently removed some time ago and the ones on the north side and east side have also been removed and as we do not think the appearance of the building suffers to any great extent by their omission, would advise that they are left off. If you decide that you want them replacing, this can be done but we do feel in general that the expense would not really be justified.




