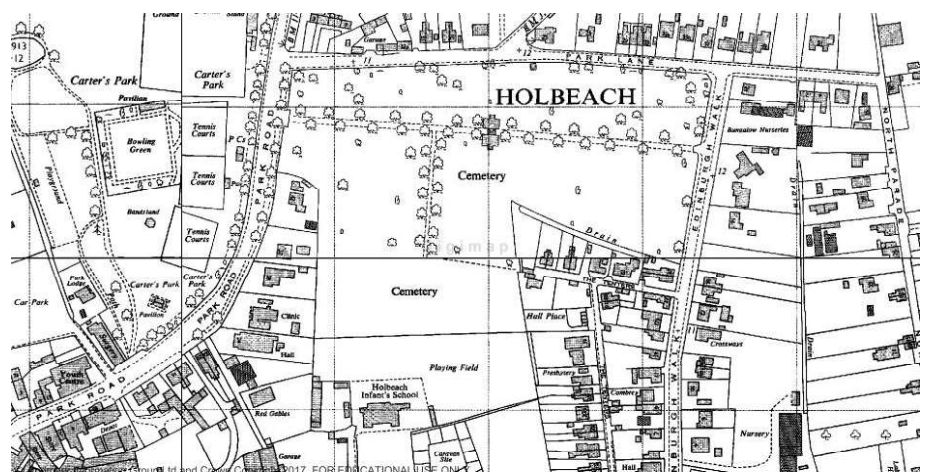
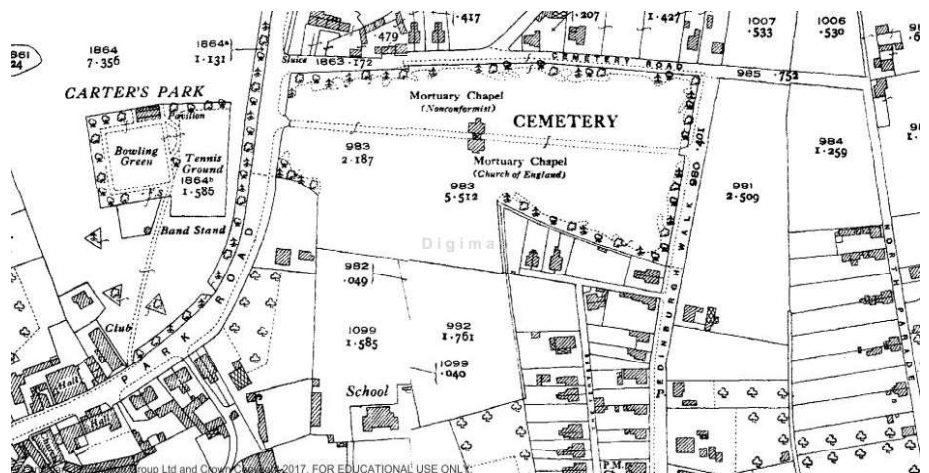
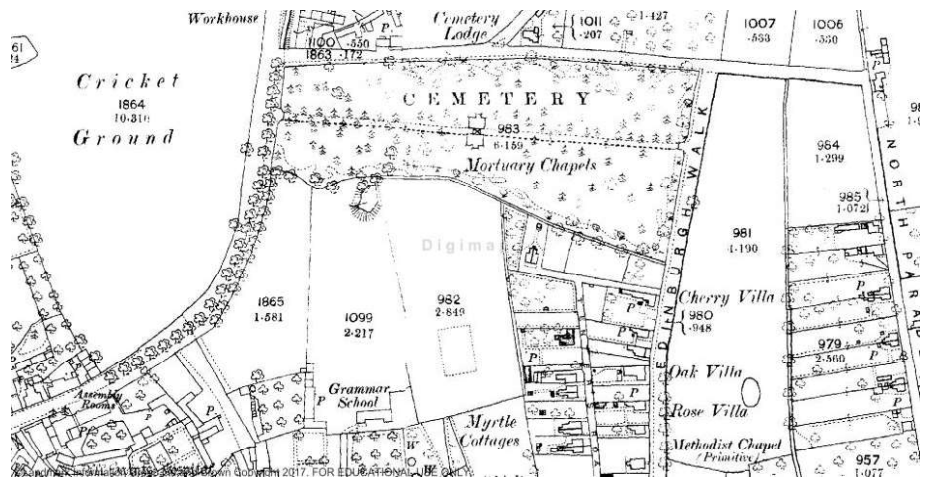


The Cemetery




Around 1849 it was decided that there was a need for a new cemetery and so the land was purchased for £795. The Chapel was built in the centre of the cemetery at a cost of £2457 and in 1855 the south chapel and grounds were consecrated by the bishop of Lincoln whilst the north chapel and grounds was left unconsecrated for dissenters. In 1952 the north chapel was closed as the roof was in a poor state. The spire was also causing concern and in 1954 maintenance was undertaken in which 2&1/2 tons of pigeon droppings were removed along with 40 dead pigeons. The chapels are currently unused, but The Cemetery Chapels Trust are working on a project to restore them. As part of this project they have formed walking trails around the cemetery, and you can find details of these on the display board in the cemetery. Whilst walking around the cemetery you will see lots of wildlife including many species of bird squirrels and if you are lucky, deer.
