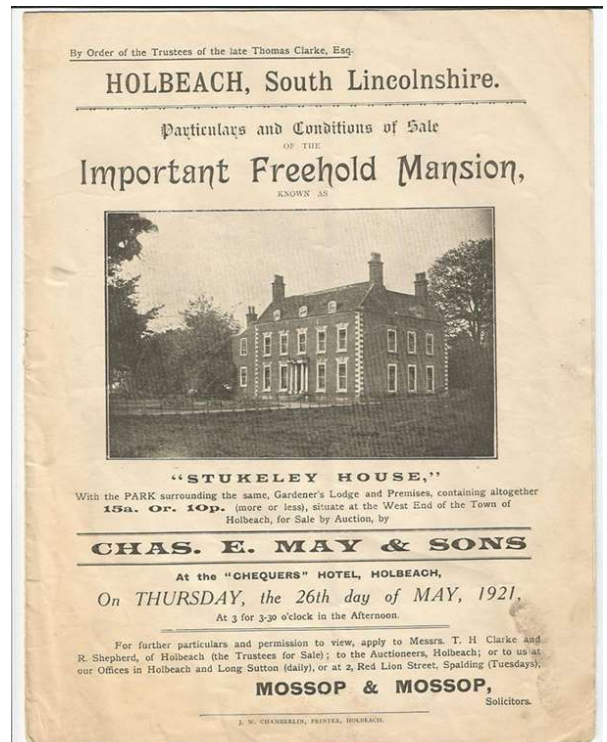


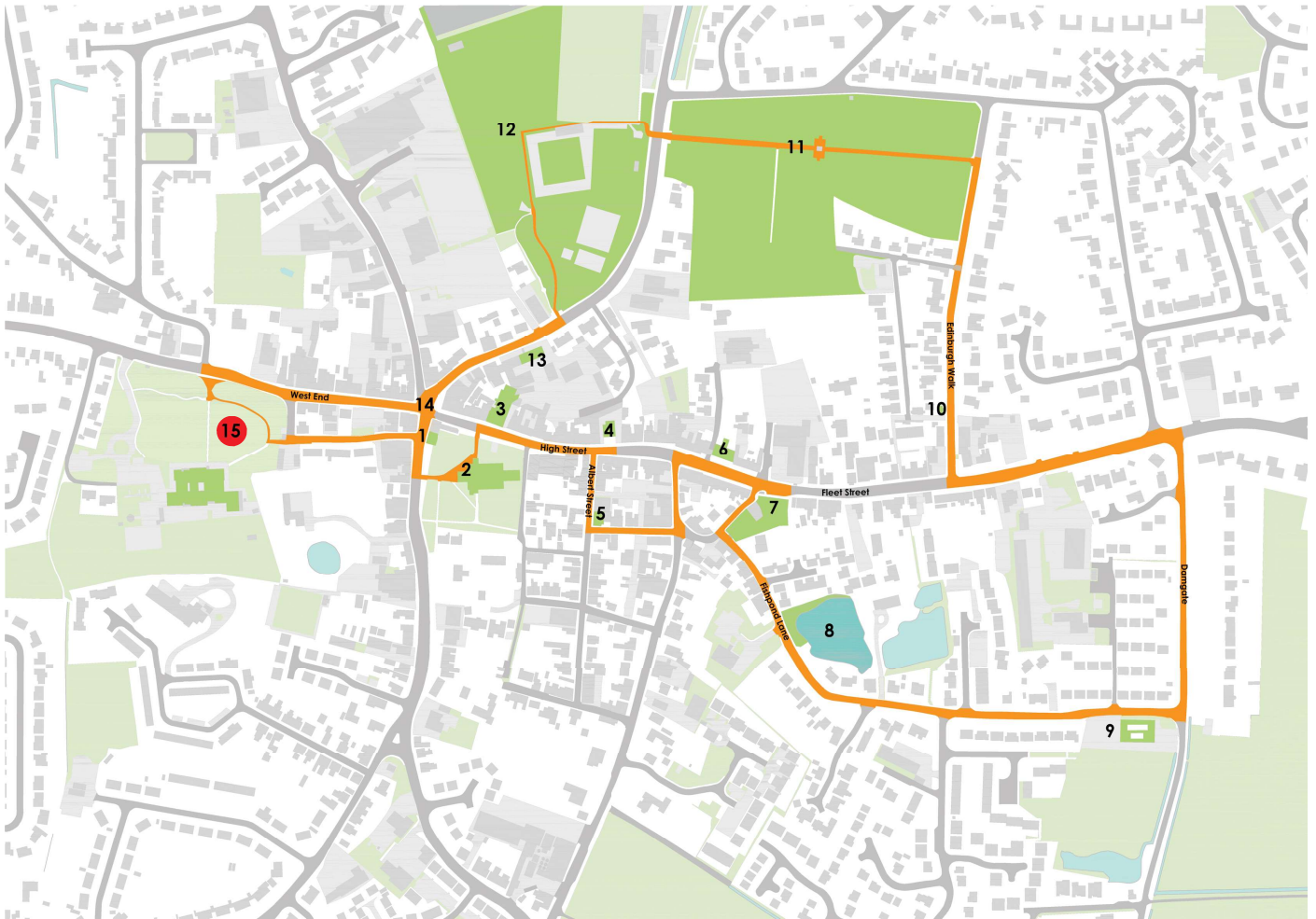
# Stukeley Hall




In the 16th Century the site belonged to the Flete family. Later in the century the Stukeley married into the family and thus inherited the estate. In 1670 William Stukeleys uncle Adlard set up his legal practice in the grounds. The house has undergone many facelifts over the years and has had many owners. In 1921 the house was bought by Herbert Carter and he set about making his mark on the property. During this time, he substantially altered the property following the design of architect E Norman Webster. After Carter died in 1944 the house was purchased by the council and became a care home for the elderly until it closed in 1988. After many years of argument over what should happen to the building it was finally demolished in 1992 to make way for the present school.
